Scheme of Examination

Part A will consist of 10 compulsory questions. There will be at least three questions from each unit and the word limit of each answer will be approximately 50 words. Each question will carry two marks. (10x2=20)

Part B will consist of 10 questions. At least three questions from each unit will be asked and the students will have to answer five questions selecting at least one question from each unit and the word limit of each answer will be up to 400 words. Each question will carry ten marks. (5x10=50)

Note- A student has to pass End of Semester Examination i.e. external theory paper and internal Continuous Assessment (CA) separately.
