Scheme of examination

"Scheme of examination for end of semester examination applicable to all undergraduate courses (Pass course as well as Honor's course).

The question paper of semester Examination for the Disciplinary Centric Core Course (DCCC), Discipline specific elective (DSE), Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Value Added Course (VAC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) will be of 35 marks and it will be divided in two parts i.e. Part A and Part-B. Part-A will consist of 10 compulsory questions. There will be at least three questions from each unit and answer to each question shall be limited up to 50 words. Each question will carry one marks. Total 10 Marks.

Part-B will consist of 10 questions. At least three questions from each unit be set and student will have to answer five questions, selecting at least one question from each unit. The answer to each question shall be limited to 400 words. Each question carries 05 Marks. Total 25 Marks.

Submission of practical work (Internal Assessment)

- 1. Work should be done in the classroom duly signed by the subject teacher with date.
- Submission work will be submitted to the head of the department of drawing & painting at the time of Internal assessment.

Note:

- A. There should be minimum 10 periods for the regular study. 02 periods for theory and 08 periods for practical. One batch will consist of 12 students.
- B. There should be minimum 02 additional periods for Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) from sem. III to VI.
- C. For Second year-Sem III and Sem IV, a candidate has to choose one SEC from the discipline for each Semester.
- D. With reference to third year Sem V and Sem VI, a candidate has to opt one Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) from eac subject and three from Disciplineand one SEC from the Discipline separately.
- E. Practical Examination will be conducted at the Centre. An external examiner will examine the answer sheets in consultation with an internal examiner who is the subject teacher of the department of Drawing and Painting.
- F. There will be no supplementary examination and revaluation in practical paper.
- G. It is compulsory to pass in every paper separately including Internal assessment. Candidate should pass in theory and practical paper separately.
- H. Computer is very helpful & important to the drawing & painting students in theory & practical studies. Therefore, the dept. should take care for providing the computers to the students.
- I. The allocation of periods in the subject Drawing and Painting has not been treated as per with the other subjects like Science, etc. In Drawing and Painting, the weihtage of one practical-period is considered at the ratio of one-to-one i.e. 1=1 (100%) for calculating workload and allocation of periods are as follows for workload/Timetable purpose: Practical: 1 credit is equal to 2 periods of 2 Hrs. and it will be counted as 1=1 ratio (100%) in practical (4 Credit/8 Hrs./8 Periods) Theory: 1 credit is equal to 1 period of 1hr. and it will be counted as 1=1 ratio (100%) in Theory. (2 Credit/2 Hrs./2 Periods)
- J. The Department should also arrange for an educational tour to ancient art centers like Ajanta, Ellora, Elephanta, Khajuraho, Mahabalipuram, National Gallery of Modern art New Delhi, Art Galleries, Museums, Other Art centresatleast once in a year.

Linocut, also known as lino print, lino printing or linoleum art, is a printmaking technique in which a sheet of linoleum is used to create a raised surface. A design is cut into the linoleum surface with a sharp knife, V-shaped chisel or gouge, with the raised (un-engraved) areas reflecting a reverse (mirror image) of the printed portions. Ink is applied to the linoleum sheet with a roller

(called a brayer), and then impressed onto paper or fabric. The actual printing may be done by hand or with a printing press.

Woodcut is a relief printing technique in printmaking. An artist carves an image into the surface of a wooden block, with the printing portions remaining flat with the surface while the non-printing portions are removed. The areas cut by the artist are not inked, while the letters or images at surface level carry the ink to make the print. The block is cut along the grain of the wood (as opposed to wood engraving, where the block is cut across the end grain). The surface is covered with ink by rolling it with an ink-covered roller (brayer), leaving ink on the flat surface but not the non-printing areas.
